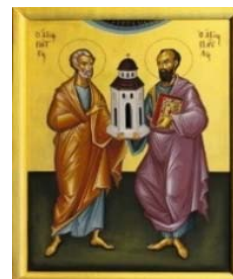


### Epistle Reading: St. Paul's Letter to the Hebrews 2:11-18

*Prokeimenon. Mode 3. Luke 1: 46-48*

*My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior.*

*Verse: For he has regarded the humility of his servant.*



Brethren, he who sanctifies and those who are sanctified have all one origin. That is why he is not ashamed to call them brethren, saying, "I will proclaim thy name to my brethren, in the midst of the congregation I will praise thee." And again, "I will put my trust in him." And again, "Here am I, and the children God has given me." Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, he himself likewise partook of the same nature, that through death he might destroy him who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong bondage. For surely it is not with angels that he is concerned but with the descendants of Abraham. Therefore he had to be made like his brethren in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make expiation for the sins of the people. For because he himself has suffered and been tempted, he is able to help those who are tempted.

### Gospel Reading: The Gospel According to Luke 1:24-38



In those days, Elizabeth the wife of Zacharias conceived and for five months she hid herself, saying, "Thus the Lord had done to me in the days when he looked on me, to take away my reproach among men." In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Hail, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and considered in her mind what sort of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your

womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there will be no end." And Mary said to the angel, "How shall this be, since I have no husband?" And the angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. And behold, your kinswoman Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. For with God nothing will be impossible." And Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her.

### **Response to Second Antiphon**

Save us, O Son of God who became incarnate for us, save us who sing to you: Alleluia (3).

### **Apolytikion of the Feast**

Today is the beginning of our salvation and the revelation of a myst'ry which was hidden from eternity. The Son of God becomes the Virgin's Son, and Gabriel announces the grace of this Good News. Let us also join with him, calling to the Theotokos: Rejoice, O woman full of grace; the Lord is with you. (Liturgy Book page 217)

### **Resurrectional Apolytikion**

Although Your tomb was sealed with a stone, O Savior, and Your most pure body was guarded by the soldiers, You rose on the third day giving life to all the world. Therefore, O giver of life, the powers of heaven praise You: Glory to Your resurrection, O Christ, Glory to Your kingdom. Glory to Your saving wisdom, O only lover of mankind. (Liturgy Book page 99)

### **Entrance Hymn**

Proclaim from day to day the salvation of our God. Save us, O Son of God, risen from the dead.

### **Kontakion**

To You, the Champion Commander, I, Your city, inscribe victorious anthems of thanksgiving, for deliverance from sufferings, O Theotokos. In as much as you have power unassailable from all manner of dangers, O set me free; that I may cry out to you: Rejoice, O Bride unwedded.

### **Megalynarion (Hymn for the Theotokos)**

Now let no uninitiated hand approach the living Ark of God to touch it. Rather let believers' lips sing out in exultation the Angel's salutation unceasingly to the Theotokos and cry out: Rejoice, Maiden full of grace! The Lord is with you.

### **Communion Hymn**

The Lord has chosen Zion; He has desired it for His habitation (3). Alleluia. (Liturgy Book page 329)

### **Hymn after Holy Communion**

We have seen the true light; we have received the heav'nly Spirit; we have found the true faith, worshiping the undivided Trinity, the Trinity who has saved us. (Liturgy Book page 87)

Taken from the Lamentations Hymns, chanted by the entire congregation on Holy Friday Evening, we celebrate Jesus Christ Who is the Light of the World. But for a brief while, this Light was removed from the earth as He was placed in the tomb. For three days, His Body was shrouded in darkness. Had He not emerged victorious from the tomb through His Resurrection, we would still be covered in darkness.

The children of our St. Anna Parish will learn what it means to live in darkness as we await the Saving Light of Jesus. We will learn, live, play and eat in darkness, then experience the joy of Light. The Light that is Christ.

Parents, please advise your children that during appointed times, your children will participate in activities with their eyes blindfolded. Children from 3rd Grade and up will spend much of their time "in darkness." Also advise your girls not to wear dresses unless they have leggings underneath. There is a portion of the day that involves (completely safe and supervised) physical activity.
