Do your best to speed Zenas the lawyer and Apollos on their way; see that they lack nothing. And let our people learn to apply themselves to good deeds, so as to help cases of urgent need, and not to be unfruitful. All who are with me send greeting to you. Greet those who love us in the faith. Grace be with you all. Amen.

In 2017, our Parish came together as a whole in the spirit of Orthodox philanthropy and generosity to raise an incredible amount of funds to serve as a \$1.25 million foundation for our Building program.

With the success of the Capital Campaign to date, the funds raised are sufficient to provide for a down payment on a suitable property or building that is to serve as our future home.

Given the knowledge that property and building costs are likely to continue to increase, we are not yet at a point where the luxury of complacency can be allowed. CLERGY-LAITY CONGRESS REPORT

Dear St. Anna Parishioners,

First of all thank you so much for the opportunity to represent our beautiful St. Anna's Parish at the Clergy-Laity Congress (CLC), together with my fellow-delegate Pat Daskalas! It was an honor to represent St. Anna's and to meet parish leaders from all over the United States. You'd be amazed to learn how many people have actually heard about our parish and have followed our success.

We arrived in Boston on a Sunday afternoon, checked-in and registered for the CLC and met new friends, found old ones and greeted attendees from Holy Trinity and Prophet Elias. Some of our old friends were Fr. Michael Kouremetis, Fr. Milton Gianulis, Fr. Joseph Strzelecki, Fr. Constantine (Bus) Lazarakis, Fr. Luke Veronis (we were in Ghana,

Africa 29 years ago), Fr. Alexander Leong (priest from Honolulu, Hawaii), Fr. Stratton Dorozenski and of course Fr. Chrysostomos Gilbert!!!

Monday morning was the Welcome Breakfast where his Eminence Archbishop Demetrios addressed the Congress. He stated that there have been issues with the finances and the budget, and the building of St. Nicholas Church, which was destroyed by the events of 9-11, but He assured us they were working towards resolving those issues and restructuring the staff at the Archdiocese. He apologized for all the issues that had happened at the National Office. We then attended Budget Meetings for the rest of the day.

Tuesday morning there were more meetings regarding the Budget and then that evening we enjoyed a Cultural Night. We were entertained by a Greek orchestra and a beautiful singer during the evening, singing Greek "oldies but goodies."

On Wednesday morning at 6:30 a.m. Fr. Anthony Savas was invited by His Eminence Isaiah to preside over the CLC Divine Liturgy, which was beautiful and memorable. After Liturgy, we joined Fr. Anthony for a Memorial Service for our beloved and departed Basil Chachas, who would have turned 14 on that day. May his memory be eternal. We considered it a blessing and comfort that our parish priest would have been assigned to celebrate services on this very day.

We again attended Budget Meetings in the morning and then we were bused to Holy Cross/Hellenic College to have lunch and tour their beautiful campus! The beautiful chapel is the highest point of Boston and you can see the entire city of Boston. We had a couple hours of free time in the afternoon, and we decided to go on the famous Duck Tour of Boston, in an amphibious vehicle that takes you through the streets of Boston AND the waters of the Charles River. What a treat!

At 4:00 p.m. we met with His Eminence Metropolitan Isaiah and all the other delegates and priests from the Denver Metropolis. His Eminence shared his thoughts regarding the financial situation at the Archdiocese and felt very positive about the progress they are making. After our meeting we stopped and had dinner at "Cheers, Where Everyone Knows Your Name" and where the opening scenes of the TV series

Cheers was filmed, and then walked back to our hotel to enjoy fabulous fireworks from our hotel room!

Thursday was the last session of the meetings we could attend, which was the Plenary Session, and where the final budget was NOT approved and the group voted for an unbalanced budget. After the Plenary Session we left for our 5:45 p.m. flight home.

Again, thank you for the opportunity for us to be the voice of our community. It was a memorable, eye-opening and spiritually rewarding experience.
