The Lord is my strength and my song.

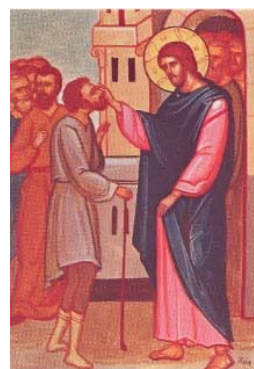
Verse: The Lord has chastened me sorely.



Brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we are not contending against flesh and blood, but against the principalities, against the powers, against the world rulers of this present darkness, against the spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places.

Therefore take the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. Stand, therefore, having girded your loins with truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the equipment of the gospel of peace; besides all these, taking the shield of faith, with which you can quench all the flaming darts of the evil one. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

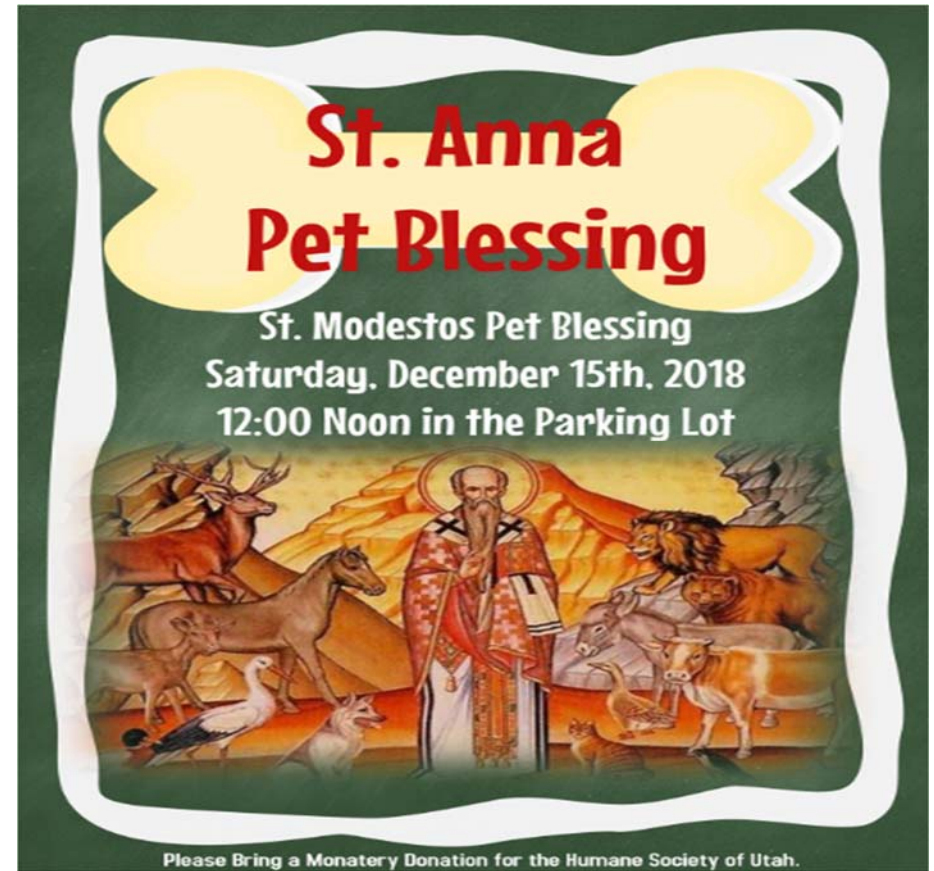

Our Fall Parish Assembly will be held **TODAY**, Sunday, December 2, 2018, in the fellowship hall immediately following fellowship hour. The Parish Assembly package was e-mailed to all 2018 stewards, and a copy of the notice and agenda was also delivered to all stewards via U.S. Mail.

ST. ANNA CAPITAL CAMPAIGN (SACC) UPDATE

The SACC is busy working toward raising the additional funds needed to finalize and attain the Atrium property as the new home of Saint Anna's Greek Orthodox Church. It is such a wonderful and excellent opportunity for our parish to have the Atrium become available to us again.

In order to minimize the need for financing and make the acquisition of the Atrium property financially feasible for our Parish, the Parish Council has set a goal of making at least a 50% down payment when we close on the property next fall. Thanks to everyone who has already contributed to our campaign, we are very close to reaching this goal. Indeed, we already have 78% of the required down payment as cash on hand! We know that with everyone's help, we can promptly raise the remaining 22% and reach our down payment goal! Every dollar donated or pledged brings us one step closer to taking advantage of this wonderful opportunity given to our parish. In addition to encouraging further support from within the parish, the SACC will be reaching out to potential donors outside of our parish both locally and nationally.
