
*You shall guard us, O Lord; You shall preserve us.

Brethren, when Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. On account of these the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience. In these you once walked, when you lived in them. But now put them all away; anger, wrath, malice, slander, and foul talk from your mouth.

Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old nature with its practices and have put on the new nature, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. Here there cannot be Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free man, but Christ is all, and in all.

Medical Advisory Ministry
Updated Recommended COVID-19 Precautions
During the Omicron Surge

The Medical Advisory Ministry (MAM) met on January 10, 2022 due to the high COVID-19 transmission levels in our community due to the Omicron variant. In accordance with recommendations from local health officials and guidance from the CDC, we support efforts to obtain benefit from multiple layers of protection.

The following recommendations take into consideration the benefit of multiple layers of protection, the ability of individuals to make their personal risk assessment and decisions that are right for them. With this in mind the MAM recommends the following.

1. With the approval of the Parish Council, we recommend members working the Narthex or Ushering to remind parishioners of the following precautions. We will also include these recommendations in the Weekly Bulletin and St. Anna Website.
 - Per current Salt Lake County Health order (01/08/2022), we are asking that all individuals (2years and older) wear masks when inside the Church and other indoor spaces, except when eating or drinking.
 - Maintain distance and space out when sitting in the Church and during other functions or meetings.
 - Frequently wash hands, use hand sanitizer before and after Church, avoid touching your mask.
 - Stay home if you are sick
2. Cleaning protocols will continue including routine cleaning scheduled and groups wiping tables and high touch services before and after meeting.

3. Building ventilation will be maximized by keeping one vent open in the Church and one cooler fan will be turned on during Church Services.
4. Fellowship hour will resume with coffee and light food.
5. Recommendations for food and beverage services include:
 - a. Please remember to keep your mask on unless you are eating or drinking.
 - b. Tips for safe food service include preference for pre-packaged individual portions.
 - c. If offering food that is not individually packaged, keep it covered and use servers.
 - d. Servers are asked to wear a mask and disposable gloves when serving.
 - e. Have hand sanitizer available at the buffet table and other tables.

All you have to do is text the amount you want to donate followed by the applicable account code (\$xx 0x) to 844-936-2414 (St. Anna's dedicated Give+ Text number). The credit card entered at the time of your initial registration will be charged your donation amount, and you will receive a confirming text message.
