Epistle Reading: Paul's Letter to the Hebrews (Heb. 4:14-16; 5:1-6)

Prokeimenon. Mode pl. 2. Psalm 27.

O Lord, save Your people, and bless Your inheritance. Verse: To You, O Lord, I cry; O my God, may You not pass over me in silence.



Brethren, since we have a high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to

help in time of need. For every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness. Because of this he is bound to offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not take the honor upon himself, but he is called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not exalt himself to be made a high priest, but was appointed by him who said to him, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; as he says also in another place, "You are a priest for ever, after the order of Melchizedek."

Fr. James Tavlarides served our Metropolis with great love and distinction. He is the uncle of Myra Shenk. The Shenk and Steele families donated the icon of St. Iakovos on our iconostasis in memory of Fr. Tavlarides and his ministry. And of course, the icons of St. Ambrose of Milan and St. Iakovos the Brother of our Lord were chosen to honor the memories of the two, beautiful priests who served our budding mission church so lovingly.

Fr. Jimi celebrated the very first Divine Liturgy for our newlyformed community on August 31, 2014. Every time Fr. Jimi would visit, his smile, laughter, and engaging love for Christ would gather us together like a big, bear hug. On the opposite end of the physical spectrum, Fr. Ambrose was a slight wisp of a man, perhaps weighing in at 120 pounds. But he filled a room with his wisdom, grace and dedication. Fr. Ambrose served as the most regular visiting priest in the critical first year of the parish. He was with the parish when it opened its temporary worship space at St. Thomas More Catholic Church and celebrated the parish's first Holy Week and Pascha (Easter). Both of these gifted priests made us laugh. They made us think. They taught us to pray. And they gave the people of the Greek Orthodox Mission Parish of Utah the confidence to push through, ignore the chatter, overcome the challenges, and work together for the sake of the Gospel, to the glory of God, and to the benefit of His precious children.

Both of these men were taken from this world much too soon. Presbytera Eleni and her children are with us today so that through her, we can express our love, gratitude, respect and prayers for these priests who still serve before Christ's heavenly altar. They are priests forever. May the Memories of Fr. Ambrose, Fr. James, and Fr. Jimi be ever eternal!

ST. ANNA SERVICE MINISTRY FOOD SUPPORT PROGRAM

What is the Food Support Program?

In 2021 in response to the critical need to address hunger in our community, St. Anna established our Church building as a permanent collection site to supplement local pantries that distribute food to families in need throughout the Sandy area.

Who does this program serve?

The program provides ongoing food support to three pantries located at Diamond Ridge/Entrada Schools in the Canyon School District. Due to growing need these pantries currently serve and support 2700 individuals per month compared to the 350 people in 2021.

How do we support this program?

Parishioners can bring nonperishable food items to place in the Blue Bin whenever the church is open. In addition, our community neighbors have been invited to participate by donating nonperishable food items every Tuesday.

Where is the Blue Bin located?

The Blue Bin is located in the Fellowship Hall for all parishioners. On Tuesdays, between 10:00 am and 5:00 pm, the Blue Bin is placed outside for parishioners and community neighbors to drop off donations. A flag is also placed outside as a reminder.

When is the donated food delivered?

Once a week, volunteers from our Men's Ministry collect and deliver the food donations to the Diamond Ridge/Entrada pantries in Sandy.

What food items are needed?

All canned meats and fish, canned vegetables and fruit, instant meals such as Cup o' Noodles and Mac and Cheese, granola bars and snack items, peanut butter, jelly, rice, noodles, flour, sugar and dry milk.

STEWARDSHIP ANNOUNCEMENTS

Thank you to all who have turned in their 2024 stewardship commitment cards. As of March 31, we have received 154 commitments totaling \$420,034, putting us at 92.3% of our budgeted goal (\$455,000).

The 2024 budget approved at our Fall Parish Assembly calls for a fourteen percent (14%) increase in total stewardship commitments (as compared to the 2023 budget) to meet the increased financial commitments associated with the financing obtained to fund the purchase of our property, the build out of our sanctuary, and the other renovations and improvements at our church. With the support and participation of our faithful parishioners we are confident this goal can be achieved.

If you are new to the community and would like to become a St. Anna steward, you can still obtain a 2024 stewardship commitment card. They are on display in the Narthex and available on the <u>parish website</u>. The generosity and vision of our parishioners has historically been a defining aspect of this community.
