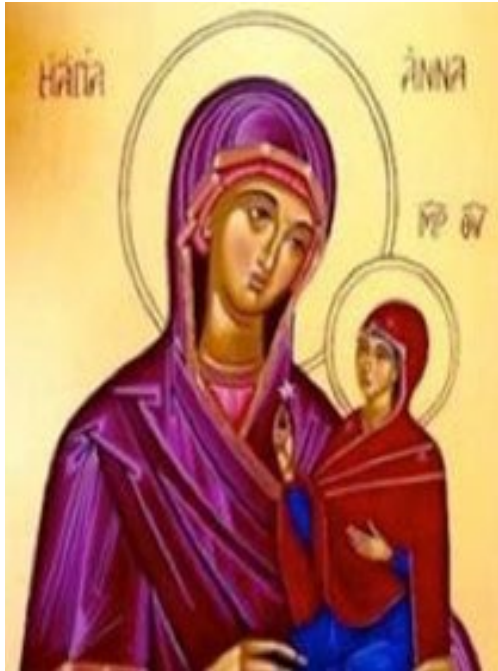

## Epistle Reading: Paul's Letter to the Romans (13:11-14; 14:1-4)

*Prokeimenon. Mode pl. 4. Psalm 75.*

*Pray and return to the Lord Your God.*

*Verse: In Judah God is known; His name is great in Israel.*



Brethren, salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed; the night is far gone, the day is at hand. Let us then cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves becomingly as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires. As for the man who is weak in faith, welcome him, but not for disputes over opinions. One believes he may eat anything, while the weak man eats only vegetables. Let not him who eats despise him who abstains, and let not him who abstains pass judgment on him who eats; for God has welcomed him. Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? It is before his own master that he stands or falls. And he will be upheld, for God is able to make him stand.

Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor

rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.”

## CONVERSATIONS ABOUT STEWARDSHIP

### *SHOPPING AT THE ST. ANNA BOOKSTORE*

If you walk toward the Sunday School rooms and look to your right, you will see that the St. Anna Bookstore has reopened. You are also likely to notice Stefan Nagy, the new manager, and his team taking orders, stocking the shelves, and running the cash register.

Stefan's day job is researching and teaching Computer Science at the University of Utah. So I asked Stefan... Why did you take this on? His answer, "Because I think our Bookstore has a lot of potential to serve our parishioners... to help them with their religious educations, personal spiritual journeys, baptisms, weddings, and parenting and teaching their own children."

Stefan also believes the Bookstore is an important source of support for Orthodox content creators and vendors. Many of the icons the Bookstore sells, for example, are made by the monastics from Holy Transfiguration Monastery in Boston. Other Monasteries produce goods as varied as soaps, honey, teas, coffee beans, and dog training manuals—all of which the Bookstore will soon carry!

Stefan has the Bookstore up and running. Over time, he plans to expand its open hours and range of products and services. He needs help to do this. He would like to have the Bookstore open after every Sunday liturgy and most major services. He needs stewards willing to serve as cashiers and guide customers, as well as help curate and recommend new offerings (books, icons, and other religious items) and design seasonal displays.

With that said, stewardship is about giving yourself to make a difference in others' lives. Stefan grew up attending a catechumen-driven mission parish (St. Mary Magdalene Orthodox Church) in Manhattan, Kansas. So, he especially appreciates the opportunities to help people that are new to Orthodoxy select their very first icons for their very first prayer corners.

Shopping at the St. Anna Bookstore is a great way to find new items for yourself and for others. At the same time, you are not only supporting our parish, but also the broader worldwide Orthodox Christian community.

## STEWARDSHIP ANNOUNCEMENTS

Thank you to all who have turned in their 2025 stewardship cards. As of February 24, we have received 142 stewardship commitments totaling \$397,138, putting us at 81% of our budgeted goal (\$490,000).

In 2024, our parish collected \$475,540 in Stewardship donations. To ensure we meet the continued financial commitments of our parish, the 2025 budget approved at our Fall Parish Assembly includes Stewardship donations totaling \$490,000, representing a three percent (3%) increase compared to 2024 collections. With the continued support and participation of our dedicated parishioners, we are confident this objective can be achieved!

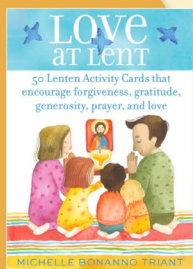
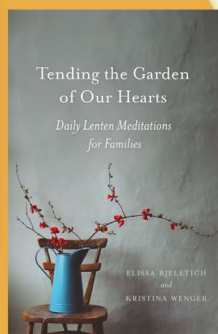
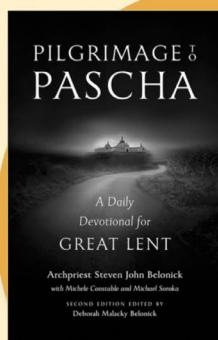
