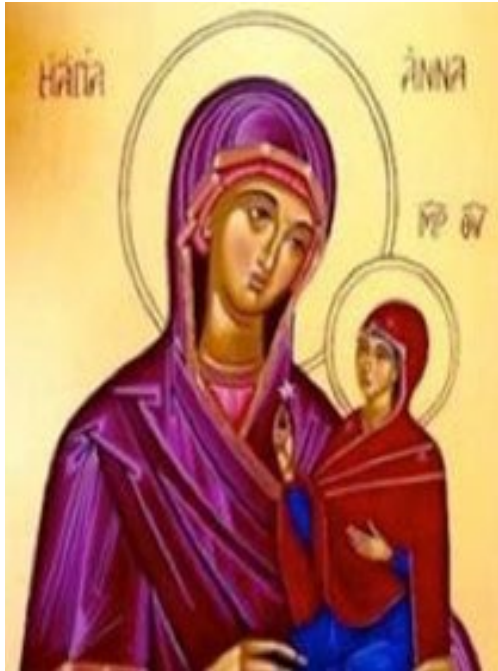

Epistle Reading: Paul's Letter to the Hebrews (1:10-14; 2:1-3)

Prokeimenon. Mode pl. 1. Psalm 11.

You shall guard us, O Lord; You shall preserve us.

Verse: Save me, O Lord, for the holy man has ceased.



“In the beginning, Lord, you founded the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands; they will perish, but you remain; they will all wear out like clothing; like a cloak you will roll them up, and like clothing they will be changed. But you are the same, and your years will never end.” But to what angel has he ever said, “Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet”? Are they not all ministering spirits sent forth to serve, for the sake of those who are to obtain salvation? Therefore we must pay closer attention to what we have heard, lest we drift away from it. For if the message declared by angels was valid and every transgression or disobedience received a just retribution, how shall we escape if we neglect such a great salvation? It was declared at first by the Lord, and it was attested to us by those who heard him.

Gospel Reading: The Gospel According to Mark (2:1-12)



At that time, Jesus entered Capernaum and it was reported that he was at home. And many were gathered together, so that there was no longer room for them, not even about the door; and he was preaching the word to them. And they came, bringing to him a paralytic carried by four men. And when they could not get near him because of the crowd, they removed the roof above him; and when they had made an opening, they let down the pallet on which the paralytic lay. And when Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, “My son, your sins are forgiven.” Now some of the scribes were sitting there, questioning in their hearts, “Why does this man speak thus? It is a blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?” And immediately Jesus, perceiving in

his spirit that they thus questioned within themselves, said to them, "Why do you question thus in your hearts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise, take up your pallet and walk? But that you may know that the Son of man has authority on earth to forgive sins" – he said to the paralytic – "I say to you, rise, take up your pallet and go home." And he rose, and immediately took up the pallet and went out before them all; so that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, "We never saw anything like this!"

CONVERSATIONS ABOUT STEWARDSHIP

ST. ANNA GREEK ORTHODOX CHURCH WORKS

I recently spoke with Ron Steele about the Men's Ministry and its plans for 2025. Four years ago, with our newly acquired property to care for, Fr. Anthony asked Ron to lead the ministry and support our emerging needs. Since then, the Ministry has evolved into a cornerstone of our community, blending service and worship into Parish life.

The Men's Ministry takes on several responsibilities, including:

- Grounds Maintenance – Keeping the Parish grounds well-maintained;
- Event Support – Assisting with setup, cooking, and cleanup for Parish events;
- Food Service Program – Delivering contributions to local food pantries; and
- Special Projects – Handling construction, repairs, and projects benefiting the Parish and broader community.

The Ministry's impact is significant, saving our Parish a substantial amount of money by helping to reduce operational and project costs. For example, improvements made to a gifted house greatly increased its market value.

Beyond financial benefits, the Ministry fosters a sense of community. As our Parish grows with individuals and families from diverse backgrounds, worship unites us spiritually, while working together strengthens our bonds as a community.

Ron anticipates that the Men's Ministry will expand its role even further, especially as we begin renting out the social hall more regularly. This may involve event supervision, setup and cleanup, and security support.

As a member of the Men's Ministry, I can attest that working together in service is deeply fulfilling. If you're looking for a meaningful way to contribute, consider joining us. Together, we are building a stronger Parish and community.

Parking Reminder: Please park only in designated, striped spots. Do not park in undesignated areas or block other vehicles. Overflow parking for St. Anna parishioners and guests is available in the Lunatic Fringe lot (south) and KinderCare lot (north). Parking under the bell tower is NOT permitted.

STEWARDSHIP ANNOUNCEMENTS

Thank you to all who have turned in their 2025 stewardship cards. As of March 5, we have received 154 stewardship commitments totaling \$423,938.00, putting us at 86.5% of our budgeted goal (\$490,000).

In 2024, our parish collected \$475,540 in Stewardship donations. To ensure we meet the continued financial commitments of our parish, the 2025 budget approved at our Fall Parish Assembly includes Stewardship donations totaling \$490,000, representing a three percent (3%) increase compared to 2024 collections. With the continued support and participation of our dedicated parishioners, we are confident this objective can be achieved!

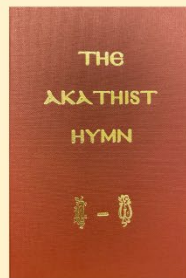
