Epistle Reading: Paul's Letter to the Hebrews (9:1-7)

Prokeimenon. Mode 3. Ode ix.

My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior.

Verse: For he has regarded the low estate of his handmaiden. For behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed.



Brethren, the first tent had regulations for worship and an earthly sanctuary. For a tent was prepared, the first one, in which were the lamp stand and the table and the bread of the Presence; it is called the Holy Place. Behind the second curtain stood a tent called the Holy of Holies, having the golden altar of incense and the ark of the covenant covered on all sides with gold, which contained a golden urn holding the

manna, and Aaron's rod that budded, and the tables of the covenant; above it were the cherubim of glory overshadowing the mercy seat. Of these things we cannot now speak in detail. These preparations having thus been made, the priests go continually into the outer tent, performing their ritual duties; but into the second only the high priest goes, and he but once a year, and not without taking blood which he offers for himself and for the sins committed unintentionally by the people.

Gospel Reading: The Gospel According to Matthew (19:16-26)



At that time, a young man came up to Jesus, kneeling and saying, "Good Teacher, what good deed must I do, to have eternal life?" And he said to him, "Why do you call me good? One there is who is good. If you would keep enter life. the commandments." He said to him. "Which?" And Jesus said, "You shall not kill, You shall not commit adultery, You shall not steal, You shall not bear false

witness, Honor your father and mother, and You shall love your

neighbor as yourself." The young man said to him, "All these I have observed from my youth; what do I still lack?" Jesus said to him, "If you would be perfect, go, sell what you possess and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me." When the young man heard this he went away sorrowful; for he had great possessions. And Jesus said to his disciples, "Truly, I say to you, it will be hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven. Again I tell you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." When the disciples heard this they were greatly astonished, saying, "Who then can be saved?" But Jesus looked at them and said to them, "With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

<u>Church Etiquette:</u> As we return to the routine of Sunday School, please refresh yourself on the basics of Orthodox church etiquette:

- Do not enter or move around the sanctuary at the following times:
 - During the Small Entrance (when the procession with the Gospel takes place)
 - During the Epistle Reading
 - During the Gospel Reading
 - During the priest's sermon

- When the priest is censing and facing the congregation
- During the Great Entrance (when the procession of the Holy Gifts takes place)
- ❖ When the priest is blessing the congregation
- ❖ During the recitation of the Nicene Creed ("I believe...")
- During the Consecration of the Holy Gifts
- During the recitation of the Lord's Prayer ("Our Father...")
- ❖ Any other time during a service when the priest is on the altar facing the congregation.
- Please silence and refrain from using your cell phones in the sanctuary.
- Please remain standing throughout Holy Communion, even if you are not receiving.
- Please follow the instructions provided by the clergy and/or the Parish Council relating to dismissal for Holy Communion and receiving antidoron. Please do <u>not</u> leave your seat or row to process to the altar until invited to do so by a Parish Council usher.
- Greeting, talking to, or visiting with other parishioners should be reserved for after services, when congregated in the exonarthex (the area between the front doors of the church and the entrance to the narthex) or fellowship hall. It is inappropriate to greet, talk to, or visit fellow parishioners while processing to receive or while returning to your seat after receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion, or when processing to receive or leaving the church after receiving antidoron.

The cooperation of all parishioners in maintaining the proper decorum during all services is much appreciated.

<u>Children's Liturgy Bags:</u> The children's activity bags are available for use during church services and are not meant to be taken home.

Please be sure to return the bags following the service so they can be restocked and reused for future services. If you inadvertently took a bag home, please return it the next time you come to church.

<u>Parking Reminder:</u> Park only in designated, striped spots. Do not park in undesignated areas or block other vehicles. Overflow parking is available in the Lunatic Fringe lot (south) and KinderCare lot (north). Parking under the bell tower is <u>NOT</u> permitted. Your cooperation is appreciated!

<u>Introducing the Roots and Fruits of Orthodoxy:</u> We would like to introduce our newly expanded initiative on Adult Religious Education at St. Anna's. In an effort to more fully integrate people in the lifestyle changes of becoming Orthodox Christians, and to more completely integrate them into the life of our local parish, we have re-imagined the way that people are informed and integrated into the community. So, we are officially introducing The Roots and Fruits of Orthodoxy.

This initiative is meant to expand upon our former vision of inquirers' classes. Our formal religious education experience will now be a two-year process and is designed to on-board individuals, couples and families into the Greek Orthodox Church, and to expand their learning opportunities. The first-year class, "The Roots of Orthodoxy," is designed to introduce people to the concepts, theology, doctrine, history, traditions, practices, worship, art, architecture, hymnography, and spiritual life of the Church. The second year class, "The Fruits of Orthodoxy" is created to expand upon those topics and further immerse the participants into

a deeper understanding of spirituality, worship and practice. You need to maintain strong roots in order to bear more fruits. Our team prayerfully feels that giving people more time to spend in study, with the comradery and friendship of fellow participants gives more time for bonding and the fostering of relationships within the community.

We will kick off this new adventure with a wine and cheese mixer for all who are interested in participating in either class, on Tuesday, September 23, 2025, at 7:00 p.m. Classes will formally begin the following week, on Tuesday, September 30, 2025, and continue weekly through Tuesday February 23, 2026 (just before Great Lent begins). For those who are brand new to the Faith, for those fairly new to the Faith, and for those who want to rediscover and more fully appreciate their faith, this experience is for you!


